Overview

Year 10 and Year 11 students interested in medical careers can apply for the Medical Immersion Program. Founded in 2020 with the goal of exposing students in medical professions, the program provides support for students in their academic and personal development. This three night camp offers an opportunity to immerse students in real life medical experiences and connect with like-minded students.

What participation includes

- Introduction to Patient-Based Learning
- Special sessions with clinical and research specialists
- Tours of Herston Medical Precinct and Uni SC
- Hands-on experience in anatomy, microbiology and clinical skills
- Meaningful interactions with current medical students, faculty, and staff
- Seminars on medical school application processes, resilience and life as a student
- Social activities (such as trivia nights, physical activities, movie nights, etc.).

Cost

The fee for the Medical Immersion Program is \$375.00. This fee includes accommodation, 9 meals at Mercure Sunshine Coast Kawana Waters found on the lake at Birtinya. Additional expenses included in fee are transport costs, clinical activities and program delivery. A non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 is due after students receive notification of acceptance into the program. The remaining balance is due three weeks before the program starts.

Application Process

Outlined below is the process for identifying students who are eligible for the Medical Immersion Program. A range of evidence will be used to identify successful students.

Step One – Identification

Application form is completed and submitted with supporting documentation eq. school reports, letters of endorsement. Students are expected to type a statement (no more than A4) addressing the following questions:

- Who am I? (Personal attributes, academic strengths, extra-curricular involvement)
- What are my aspirations for the future and how will this program support me with that?
- Why should I be considered?

Step Two - Selection

A panel to determine student eligibility for the Medical Immersion Program will review applications. Announcements of successful applicants of the Medical Immersion Program will be at the end of Term 3. They (as well as unsuccessful applicants) will be notified through email.

Step Three – Monitoring during program

Participants are expected to stay for the duration of the program.

Students are expected to attend all sessions.

A high level of behaviour and attitude is agreed to.


