Kawana Waters State College students do voluntary work in Cambodia!



In June a group of 40 year 10, 11 and 12 students and members of staff are travelling to Cambodia to do voluntarily work in village communities, schools and health clinics. They will volunteer in small village schools set up by the Australian based organisation 'Growing Cambodia'. They will also do health education for the international charity, 'Days for Girls'.

This is the third time Kawana students have participated in international volunteer programs and it is a wonderful opportunity to make a positive impact globally.

Did you know that in Cambodia:

- many children do not have basic school equipment such as pencils and paper.
- > many girls do not attend school because they cannot afford to purchase sanitary protection
- > many children and adults have missing limbs as a result of stepping on landmines
- > many children who do go to school, sit on bare dirt
- > many people become ill because they do not have ready access to health facilities

Our college has a chance to making a positive contribution to a global society.

Donation Day is Friday 24 May.

On Donation Day we ask all students from Prep to Year 12 donate items for children in Cambodia.

Our students and staff will take your donations and hand them directly to children in need.

This year we are requesting:

- A small pencil case with 4 pencils, a pen, an eraser and a sharpener. You can also pop in a small note or picture for the child who receives the pencil case.
- A multipack of face washers (cheap brands are fine)
- A multipack of girl's underwear (cheap brands are fine) in sizes 10-12 & 12-14.
