
KWSC LESSON STRUCTURE

ENTRY ROUTINES

Establishes consistency. Activates prior knowledge.



Explicit classroom entry and transition routines —

Visual display and discussion of learning goals

Warm up activity to prompt engagement —

Retrieval practice activity to recap

Transitioning the learning responsibility


Teaching phases

Teachers implement explicit teaching, modelling and guided practice

Learning phases

Students own the learning load, track progress and demonstrate mastery









EXIT ROUTINES

Locks in the learning. Tracks progress. Ensures reflection.

Strategies to prompt students to reflect on the WHAT, WHY and HOW of curriculum and behaviour

Retrieval practice review of the learning goal -

Exit ticket linked to the learning goal —

Reflection of behaviour and learning –

Exit instructions established in routine

THE BIG PICTURE

At Kawana Waters State College, we:

- Establish and maintain entry routines
- Employ the Gradual Release of Responsibility with balance in teaching and learning phases
- Embed regular opportunities for students to engage in retrieval practice
- Support students to monitor their progress and strengthen their metacognitive skills
- Routinely use exit routines to conclude a lesson
- Incorporate spaced and interleaved practice within lessons and across units of work
- Design learning to ensure access for all students because every child can learn.
