What is the Health Education Program?

Senior students from secondary schools on the Sunshine Coast have the opportunity to study a series of Health qualifications, Certificate II in Health Support Services, Certificate II in Community Services and Certificate III in Health Services Assistant. These qualifications successfully position students with a competitive edge when pursuing a career in the Health sector. Participants will have exclusive access to the KWSC Health Education Unit one day per week. This is a state of the art, purpose built teaching space that has been labelled as “dynamic and futuristic” by key stakeholders. The Health Education Unit Includes:

- Two hospital bed simulation ward with nurses station
- Two Health Education simulated teaching spaces
- Observation station set up with sound, microphone and two 65” monitoring screens
- Health monitoring equipment
- Patient dressing station
- Comprehensive medical supplies
- Computer work stations and 3D Printer
