Executive Principal's Report



Dear School Community

Welcome to the final newsletter of 2024.

Our Year 12 students have now left us for a well-deserved break before they commence university or other further study, apprenticeships or full and parttime work to kick off their careers.

Their program of events, study and examinations over the past month has been gruelling and we now wait with anticipation for ATAR results to be released on Friday 13 December and the first QTAC offer rounds on Monday 23 December and Thursday 16 January. Again in 2024, all Year 12 graduates have achieved their Queensland Certificate of Education. All staff wish these students the very best in the future and we look forward to hearing about their achievements

and endeavours.

Final Assessments and Report Cards

Year 10 and 11 students are sitting exams and completing assessment with their final day being Friday 22 November. Prep to Year 9 students' final assessments will be taking place in weeks 9 and 10 of term and report cards are scheduled to be emailed to parents on Monday 9 December for all year levels.

Final Week of the School Year (December 9-13)

Every six to seven years, the Queensland school calendar requires a recalibration and in doing so we have an extra week added to the school year. As such Term 4 this year is an 11-week term.

This year, while our academic school year finishes on Friday 6 December, there is one more gazetted week that our gates will be open for students. Schools will close for summer vacation on Friday 13 December.

The Department of Education has given permission for all schools to continue with the 10-week academic



Term followed by a week of supervised programmes not directly connected with the Australian curriculum. Therefore, all school learning, programs and events will be completed by Friday 6 December. In our school, that will mean by Friday 6 December we will have completed:

- All learning and assessments necessary for the year,
- · Report cards,
- All ceremonies (eg. Graduation and Celebrations of Learning),
- All transitions days into Prep and Year 7 and any Stepup activities for other year levels.

Any families wishing to undertake any alternative activities (eg holidays) will be able to do so from the end of the day Friday 6 December.

In week 11, from Monday 9 December, any students attending school will be involved in supervised alternative activities and not their regular class-based programs. It should be noted:

- Students may not necessarily be supervised by their regular teacher,
- Students will be combined into groups depending on the students who are at school,
- Groups of teachers will be taken off line to work on planning and preparation for the 2025 school year,
- The School Canteens will only be open at first break Monday to Wednesday and closed Thursday and Friday.
 Therefore, students will be required to bring their own food and drink for outside of these times,
- Uniform is still expected to be worn each day.

College Strategic Directions 2025

As I have repeatedly shared, Kawana Waters State College students continue to do very well academically with a pass rate above 96% and over 65% of all results being an A or B. We also understand that achieving best outcomes for every student in our college is not just about academic performance. As such we continue to expand our co-curricular opportunities for students in leadership, sport, the arts, camps, international experiences and other cultural and academic specialities. We also continue to strengthen our Student Services team to provide additional supports beyond the classroom to maintain and enhance student well-being, including Guidance Officers, Health Nurse, Psychologist, School-based

Police Officer, Chaplain and Year Level Co-ordinators.

Changes to Uniform Purchasing Location

Please note that from Monday 23 September, Kawana Waters State College uniform items will be available at 'School Locker' in the Homemaker Centre, 55 Maroochy Boulevarde. This offers many benefits to parents in terms of opening hours 7 days a week, including school holidays, ample fitting rooms, expert staff, online ordering, easy payment options and the overall cost of uniform items will be less than current school-based purchasing arrangements.

Finance

Last fortnight details about 2025 Student Resource Scheme (SRS) fees were emailed to parents of existing and future students and invoices were also emailed home.

- Minimum deposit of 20% due by Friday 31 January, 2025
- Full payment by Monday 31 March, 2025

It is important that these payment dates are adhered to, as staff cannot buy resources for students until funds become available. Students cannot be given subject resources until at least a payment plan is in place. If you do not wish to be part of the SRS, parents will be required to source all of their own texts, online resources and physical materials, amounting to many hundreds of dollars per subject. SRS Payments

Uniforms

- Please note one of the most important items is a school hat, as this allows your child to go out and enjoy play time safely. The office does not have spare ones to provide students so make sure this is top of the list!

• When purchasing shoes, compliant shoes are all black leather or leather like. Please note shoes cannot have mesh, cloth or colour. The new year is the perfect opportunity to ensure your child has shoes that meet our school uniform policy and are safe to wear. Shoes must also cover the whole of the top of the foot. Mary-Jane style is not permitted. Shoes however, do not need to be a formal shoe. A runner type shoe is perfectly acceptable and very practical, as long as it is all black leather or leather like.
