## **Executive Principal's Report**



Dear parents, carers and community,

Welcome to our March college newsletter.

With assessment time upon us, I believe it is timely to look at some **tips** for **students** as they prepare for end of term.

 Review the subject material - go through all the course materials and take notes. Highlight important concepts, formulas, and definitions to help your recall

- Practice regularly set a schedule to practice regularly (should already be in place, but starting now is better than not). Use past papers, quizzes and tests to practice and review what you have learned
- Seek help if you have any doubts or questions, seek help from your teacher, tutor or classmates. They may be able to offer insights and clarify any issues
- Stay organised organise your study space and create a study plan. This can help you stay focused and on track
- Manage your time set a realistic timeline for your assessment preparation. Break down the material into manageable chunks and allocate time to each. Also, make sure you take breaks and rest properly. At Kawana Waters State College we recommend up to an hour per week in Prep -2 where parents reading to and with students is important. In Year 3 6 we recommend between 30 and 50 minutes per day. In Year 7, approximately 70 minutes per day and this increases progressively to Year 11 and 12 where we recommend at least 2 hours per night if students are going to achieve their best



 Relax and stay positive - anxiety and stress can negatively affect your performance. Take time to relax and stay positive before and during the assessment.

**Building Positive Relationships** between School and Home

Positive and open communication between home and school helps provide students with the best chance to succeed. It is important for parents and schools to work together so that expectations are consistent and children are aware of appropriate and inappropriate behaviour, and the relevant associated disciplinary consequences.

#### **Secondary Campus Hours 2025**

Since 2022, we have been consulting with key bodies including P&C, College Council, Parent Engagement groups and Sunshine Coast Indigenous educators as recently as yesterday. As you know our regular hours are 8.50am to 2.50pm, however on every day we have a number of classes starting as early as 7.30am and finishing as late as 4.00pm.

The proposed change is for **students only**, to finish at 1.30pm on one day of the week. In consultations so far, the preferred day from families and community is for this to happen on a Friday. All 4 classes would still run on this day, however they would each be 10 minutes shorter. School Zone times on Nicklin Way, Sportsmans Parade and Meridian Street will be changed to support this change.

Staff would remain on site for collaborative planning in teams around curriculum, pedagogy, student well-being and professional development. These collaborative planning teams are referred to as Professional Learning Teams (PLTs). Current industrial laws only allow for staff to meet for 1 hour per week. This proposal would almost double this collaborative time and allow teachers to better support the

needs of students at our college.

For any students who are not able to leave at 1.30pm there will be a range of options:

- Supervised homework and study room
- Some tutorials
- Some students may be required to remain behind if they are not up to date with assessments

Our Primary Campus have already been running PLTs for a number of years and this has resulted in significant improvements in academic and well-being outcomes for students.

We will continue to run parent, student and community consultations where this will be a topic, however if you have any questions or concerns, or points for us to consider in our planning, please email to principal@kawanawaterssc.eq.qedu.au .

#### NAPLAN Year 3 and 5

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning at school. On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for and students are not expected to do so.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance; however, students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.

Over the test period, that is 13 - 22 March, all students in Year 3 and 5 are asked to ensure that:

- · their laptop is at school everyday
- their laptop device is fully charged and joined to the college network
- that the device meets the minimum requirements (general and technical)
- that the 2024 Locked Down Browser is loaded onto their device (advice will be provided by the school)
- they have working, wired earphones or headphones for all tests, including practice tests.



### A Day in the Life of Chemistry with 9I

Students in 9I have recently explored concepts related to acids, bases, neutralization, and indicators. Through hands-on experimentation in the laboratory, these students have gained a deeper comprehension of the subject matter and achieved impressive results, as depicted in the accompanying images. Employing universal indicators and various acid-base solutions, the class observed distinct


colour changes corresponding to different pH levels. Drawing upon their classroom learning and employing critical thinking skills, they successfully produced neutralised solutions and a spectrum of pH solutions bridging the initial acidic and basic states. Their ability to analyse and interpret data was evident in the colour spectrum they generated, showcasing their excellent analytical skills and understanding of the topic.
